Unit Risk Management Advisor

Position Description:

Advises the Unit Committee on the control and management of risk for the unit with the objective of reducing costs, injury, and illness for unit members through compliance with BSA policy in matters of training, activity planning, recordkeeping, and reporting

- Ensures tour planning is submitted for each appropriate unit activity, and draws on unit training records to ensure proper qualified leaders are engaged.
- Monitors training records and leader training activity
- Advises Committee Chairman of training opportunities and encourages adult training participation to fill need roles
- Ensures accident and illnesses related to unit activity are reported to Council
- Disseminates information related to health and safety of unit activities
- Advises unit leaders on safe and healthy scouting activities, specifically as outlined in the Guide to Safe Scouting and Age Appropriate Guidelines.
